Solutions Plumbing & Mechanical has the answers

That's the philosophy of Owner and Master Plumber Alex Evavold. That doesn't mean issues in the home won't arise, but when they do, the majority will be mechanical. Fortunately, Evavold is in a unique position to correct them. Not only is he a master plumber with 10 plus years of experience in plumbing and HVAC under his belt, he is also a licensed builder which means he knows houses inside and out.

"It's about knowing how things should be sealed when you do a penetration through the house, how that penetration should be properly flashed with the siding and not just punctured through and siliconed up. It's about knowing, when we're on a rough in with a new house or a remodel, what structural members we can cut out and not cut out and how to properly route that. Basically, it's about knowing how a house is constructed from the ground up to determine the best way to do the work and make everything as efficient as possible," Evavold said.

Positive thinking and hardworking, Evavold graduated from St. Cloud Technical College with a degree in Plumbing and HVAC the same year he graduated from Annandale High School. He spent a year working in Minot, North Dakota, coming home only on weekends to see his family, then put some more experience under his belt at Purcell Plumbing and Heating in Monticello before settling down at Precision Plumbing in St. Michael where he worked for almost nine years.

Tragedy struck in 2016 with the passing of his father-in-law, Paul Schermer who owned Paul Schermer Construction. Determined to keep the family business alive, Evavold decided to pursue a general contracting license. That was the beginning of CAP Custom Homes. But working full-time for another plumbing business, plus over-

seeing the construction business after-hours, with a wife and two small children at home was too much for Evavold so he decided to end his employment at Precision and open his own plumbing and mechanical business. Years ago, his father-in-law had set him on the path to plumbing with the conviction that plumbing, HVAC and building homes go hand-in-hand. Today, Evavold owns both CAP Custom Homes and Solutions Plumbing & Mechanical. Now, being self-employed, he is available to run both companies effectively throughout the day.

"I remember I started the company in the back seat of a truck in the middle of South Dakota," he said.

It was during the thick of the pandemic and Evavold and some buddies were heading home from a snowmobile trip. He completed the paperwork online, and submitted it then and there, officially creating his new company with the Secretary of State. The name

Solutions his Office Manager and Mother-in-law Rhonda Schermer takes credit for.

"Alex is a glass-half-full kind of guy and he's always telling me 'We don't have problems, we have solutions,' so I said that's the name, Solutions Plumbing & Mechanical," Schermer said.

Pickleball

may be the new American pastime

A court sport is sweeping the nation, and it isn't tennis or basketball. According to the Sports & Fitness Industry Association, 4.8 million people played pickleball in 2021, marking a nearly 15 percent growth in the total number of players from the year prior.

Data from the SFIA suggests pickleball is popular among people of all ages. Total participation among players between ages six and 17 (21 percent), 18 and 34 (29 percent) and 35 and 54 (20 percent) is significant, and players 65 and older also are well represented (18 percent).

As the popularity of pickleball grows, now is a great time to explore the basics of this game that's become a go-to pastime for so many people.

What is pickleball?

According to USA Pickleball™, pickleball combines many elements of tennis, badminton and ping-pong. The game is played with a paddle and a plastic ball with holes and can be played both indoors and outdoors on

a badminton-sized court with a slightly modified tennis net. Much like tennis, pickleball can be played in a singles (one-on-one) or doubles (two-on-two) format.

How long has pickleball been played?

Despite a recent and meteoric spike in popularity, pickleball has been around since 1965. The brainchild of three fathers from Bainbridge Island (which is just a brief ferry ride away from Seattle), the game was invented as a means of entertaining bored children. It has since evolved from those roots and become a wildly popular game across both the United States and Canada, and the game has even begun to spread into Europe and Asia.

How is pickleball played?

An extensive list of the rules of pickleball can be found at <https://usapickleball.org/what-is-pickleball/official-rules/rules-summary/>. A game is typically played to 11 points, and a team must win by two. Tournament

games may be played to 15 or 21, and a team must win by two.

Does pickleball utilize referees?

Recreational games of pickleball can rely on the honor system much like pick-up games of other sports do. However, USA Pickleball™ notes that referees and line judges are important components of tournament play. Why should I play pickleball?

Players enjoy the game of pickleball for a multitude of reasons, including the thrill of competition, the chance to socialize and the opportunity to exercise outside of a gym or home fitness center. But many play the game because they find it fun.

Where can I play pickleball?

- The Monticello Community Center has three indoor courts. The lines are permanent, and portable nets are available. A one-time fee is required to play. Amenities include food and restrooms. Reservations are not available. Open play is available during scheduled times. View the gym schedule online for details.
- The Bison Activity Center at Buffalo High School has eight outdoor

hard courts. You'll have to create your own lines and bring your own net. Amenities include restrooms and water. The courts are free.

•Town Center Park in St. Michael features pickleball courts. The pickleball courts are open from 7 a.m. to dusk on a first come, first-served basis. Pickleball rentals are available at the library in City Hall during open business hours.

•Delano offers opportunities for pickleball at its newly constructed courts in Riverside/Art Walk Park.

Lay your eyes on an assortment of classic and antique automobiles from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and enjoy Bluegrass jam sessions throughout the day. At 5:30 p.m. the Bluegrass Music Show begins in the barn. Bring your own lawn chair and enjoy the music. Food will be available all day.

Pork Chop Feed

The park's Pork Chop Feed on August 13 is a fundraiser to renovate the blacksmith shop. Enjoy a meal of pork chops, potato, coleslaw, a roll plus dessert and beverage from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Home baked goods and maple syrup will be for sale. Donations are appreciated.

Nobel Shadduck Festival

On September 16, Pioneer Park will honor Nobel Shadduck

and early founders of the park from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. There will be artisans, demonstrations, music, family activities and much more. The park's 21 historical buildings will also be open for touring.

As fall sets in, look for more fun like the Fall Maple Syrup Pancake Breakfast and Halloween Spooktacular.

Minnesota Pioneer Park has a proud history and looks forward to an equally distinguished future. Bishop Izen ORDINATION IS "JOYFUL" EVENT

"It was amazing, like I can't stop smiling amazing," said Peggy Marquette of her trip to the Cathedral of St. Paul in St. Paul to take part in the ordination Mass of Bishop Michael Izen. "This is something that happens a few times in life but not to someone you know personally."

Marquette and other St. Timothy Parishioners joined more than 2,500 people at the Cathedral earlier this spring to see Bishop Izen ordained.

He isn't the first St. Timothy priest to go on to become a Bishop, appointed by none other than the Pope himself, but he's the only one Marquette and others from St. Timothy's in Maple Lake can call a friend.

Bishop Izen, who served at St. Timothy from 2007 to 2012, accepted his appointment as auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis to a standing room only crowd. Archbishop Bernard Hebda remarked he had never prayed for a larger Cathedral, but they could have used one that day, Marquette said.

It was hard for Marquette to describe the atmosphere other than simply joyful and maybe a bit awe inspiring as close to 200 priests and 16 bishops all in their priestly attire processed into the 108-year-old Cathedral. "They set aside 15 minutes for them all to process in," Marquette said. Among them were seven servers, two of whom are seminarians from St. Timothy Church - Marquette's son Alex and Chris Yanta.

Representatives of the churches Bishop Izen served at in his 18 years as a priest of the archdiocese were present along with his home parish of the Divine Mercy in Faribault. Despite being gone from St. Timothy for 11 years, Bishop Izen still knew everybody's name, Marquette said. In fact, it's said he can remember everybody's name from every church and school he's ever served at.

"He never forgets a name and that really makes kids feel special. . . it makes the connection even stronger," Marquette said.

Marquette is a first-grade teacher at St. Timothy School in Maple Lake and taught during Bishop Izen's service here. She remembers how much he loved connecting with the students.

He was at the school almost every day. At lunch, the kids kept a spot open for him at every table and he would go from table to table to visit with them, she said. He played with them during recess and on Friday's he would come and wave goodbye to them for the weekend.

He is a very down-to-earth individual, who

isn't afraid to crack a joke at your expense, but in a kind way, and he always has a smile on his face, Marquette said.

"He is very joyful . . . one of those people you just always want to be around."

Bishop Izen left his mark on the parish and the school during his time in Maple Lake. He helped to lay the foundation to add 7th and 8th grades to the then K-6 school, which has proved to be very successful. He also started a program that encourages students to write letters to seminarians. That eventually played a part in Alex's journey to pursue the priesthood.

"That (letter) is one part of his story," said Marquette who talked about a recent interview her son did with The Catholic Spirit where he recalled the letter and other Bishop Izen inspired events that led to his decision to become a seminarian. In the article, Alex related an incident in the third or fourth grade where Bishop

Izen asked during a school Mass who of them wanted to be priests one day. In the article, Alex described how something "stirred up" inside of him to raise his hand.

Soon after that, Alex became an alter server for Bishop Izen.

Alex is now in his second year of major seminary. Yanta, who also served at Bishop Izen's ordination is a third year seminarian. God willing, he will be ordained a deacon in the spring and a priest next year, Marquette said.

Marquette called Bishop Izen's ordination an "amazing experience. It just left you with such a good feeling. It was like going on a pilgrimage with so many priests and nuns gathered together. It was amazing to see the bigger church gathered together."

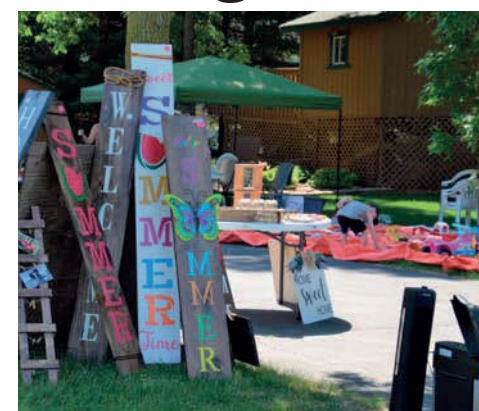

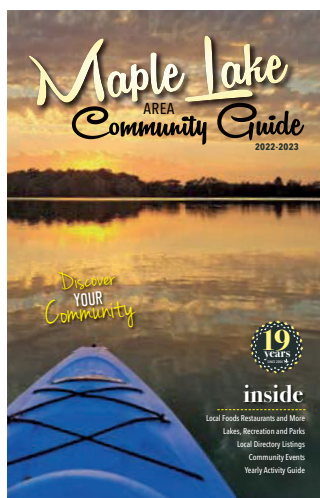

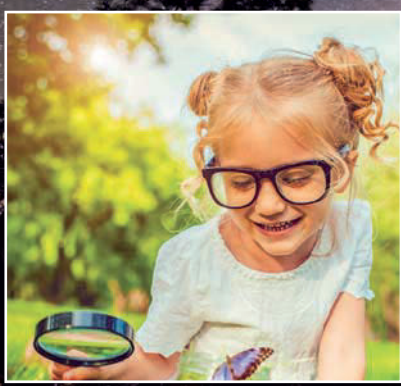

Youth programs

Little Naturalist – Designed for kids ages 3-5, but participants can be younger. The programs will be from 10:30 to 11:30 a.m. at the Robert Ney Nature Center in Maple Lake. The events start with story time, followed by nature play and crafts. Each session will have a different nature theme. The cost is \$5 per child. An adult must accompany each child. Here is the summer schedule: Wednesday, June 14 – Monarchs; Wednesday, July 19 – Mammals; Wednesday, Aug. 16 – Swans.

Nature & Learn Day Camps – Lifelong memories are made at summer camp. The Nature & Learn Day Camps are designed for children ages 6-12. Each day camp runs from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. and the cost is \$25 per child. Each camp will let kids discover nature through crafts, games, science experiments and

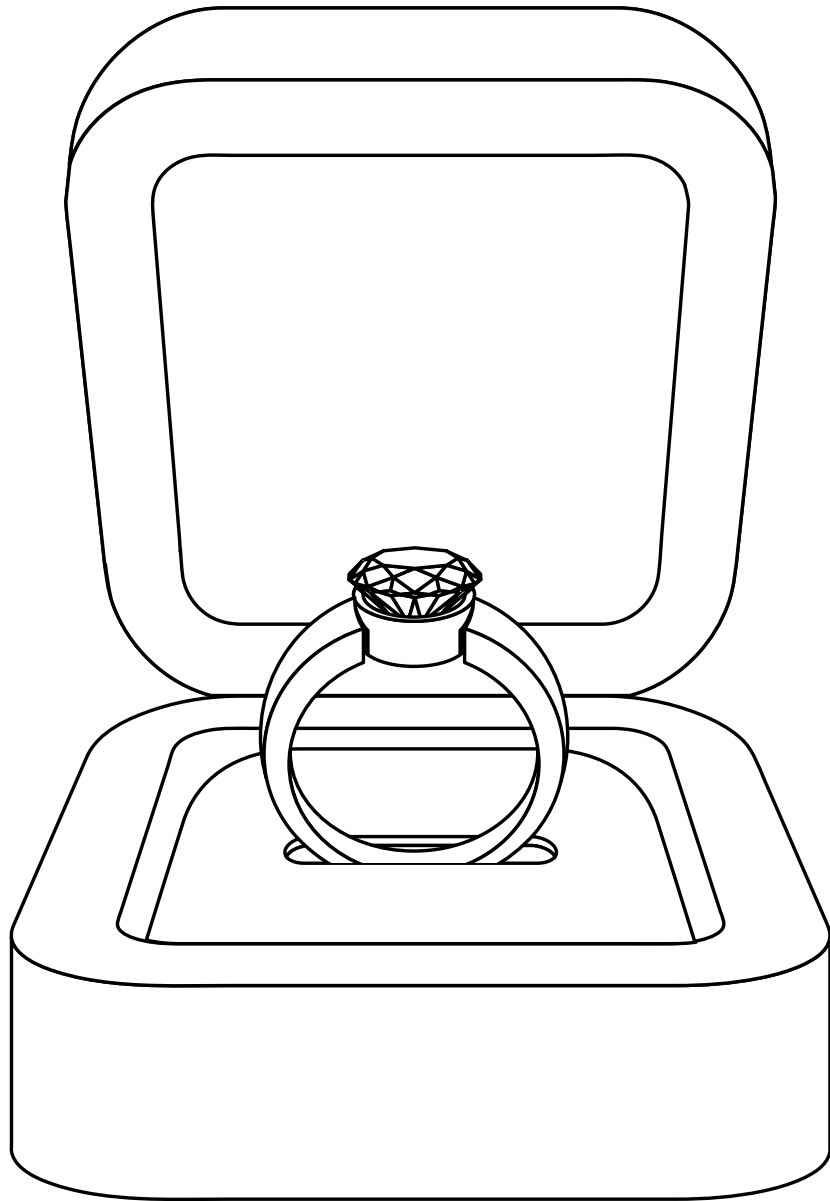
