## Artists wanted for 47th Annual St. Patrick's Day button design

Now that Christmas is over, Maple Lake's next favorite holiday, St. Patrick's Day is just around the corner.

One of the biggest festivals of the year, this annual event that features a parade, craft sale, 5K run and Queen Coronation takes place on Saturday, March 16 and with it comes the need for someone to design the St. Patrick's Day button.

The artist who submits the winning design will receive \$25 in Maple Lake business bucks, but more than that, their artwork will be displayed on jacket lapels and purses in the weeks leading up to the 1 p.m. parade. Once the submissions are in, organizers will take the button ideas to local businesses and have them choose their favorite. The festival committee will also get a chance to vote. Once the numbers are tallied, the winner will be announced in the Maple Lake Messenger sometime in February.

As soon as they are printed, the buttons will go on sale at local businesses.

Typically, the committee sells from 300 to 500 buttons depending on the year, organizers

said. The majority are sold before the festivities, but they are also sold during the parade which can attract thousands of people depending on the weather. Money raised from button sales goes toward financing paid parade entries.

Anyone who buys a button to support the parade is automatically registered to win a \$100 prize in business bucks. The button winner is typically announced in the Messenger and on the Maple Lake Chamber of Commerce website.

Stephanie Gunderson was last year's winner with her design that featured a leprechaun dangling from a sign pointing toward Maple Lake. Designs can be computer generated or hand drawn. Computer generated designs should be saved as a PDF.

Artists with designs for this year's button can drop off their entry at the Maple Lake Messenger on Division Street or email it to nick@maplelakemessenger.com. If you submitted something last year and didn't win, submit it again this year, organizers advised.

## Ice fishermen 'Flip' for Maple Lake man's newest invention

nce the ice fishing season gets going the Flippin Lid is going to fly off the shelves.

That's the prediction of Maple Lake inventor, Mike Sahli.

Sahli is certain his revolutionary new ice hole cover, the Flippin Lid will be just the thing for anglers who have ever come close to dropping their keys or phone down the hole, or those who have lost fish trying to keep valuables from going into the

The cover went on the market in September after two years of development and three prototypes, and even though the ice fishing season has been a bit of a bust so far this season, Sahli predicts, "The minute they get fish houses on the lake, word will get out."


The Flippin Lid has several key features that make it different from other ice hole covers, Sahli said. For one, you don't have to bend over to move the lid out of the way when you get a bite. That's a big benefit because it's usually in the process of bending over that those valuables slide out of the pocket. Instead, the

angler has only to step lightly on a button that pops the lid open by spring action. The other key features are the way the cover breaks in half as it opens, and the slit that the line runs along as it opens to eliminate

the attention of celebrities Babe Winkelman and Ted Nugent. Now it's only a matter of Mother Nature cooperating.

Sahli said he was ice fishing on Red Lake when he came up with the idea. He was using one of those covers that you just set down on the hole then have to reach down and remove when a fish bites, he said.

"I had my phone in my pocket and a nice walleye on the line. I was trying to move the cover and save my phone from going in and I lost the walleye," he said.

That incident inspired him to come up with a better design. He knew right away he wanted something where the angler wouldn't have to bend over. His first idea was to create something similar to a garbage can that opens when a pedal at the base is stepped on, but the solid lid kept getting in the way of the line. Finally, he settled on the current design, and it works like a dream.

"The hardest part is I'm going to ask folks to throw out all their existing covers," Sahli said. He knows how hard that will be because he has \$80 worth of covers himself, but they don't work like the Flippin Lid does, he said.

The Flippin Lid fits all standard size ice fishing holes. Sahli knows because he tested it on all the bigname fish houses including Yetti, Grey Wolf and Ice Castle. Velcro holds the lid secure to the floor to prevent it from being kicked askew. For those who have portable, flip shelters or who prefer to do their fishing directly on the ice, the foam pads you can buy at sporting goods stores work well for adhering the cover to and placing over the hole, Sahli said.

Additional features include a slot for your Vexilar cord and a slot for a fishing rod holder that Sahli sells separately. The Flippin Lid and all its components are made in the USA, and it is safe for children to be

around and use.

Currently the Flippin Lid is available locally at Cenex in Maple Lake, Tesoro BP in South Haven, and Klatt Electric in Buffalo. It can also be purchased at www.flippinlid.

An inventor at heart, Sahli is the owner of Inventitives, Inc. the Flippin Lid's parent company. Inventitives is a machining, manufacturing and equipment testing facility that got its start in the old Maple Lake Creamery building in 1990. About 15 years ago, Sahli moved his business to its current location on 1st Ave NW in Buffalo.

When he's not inventing, he manufactures medical equipment, components for labeling and carton machines and more. He currently has three patents. His first invention was the Pealer Mate. His sec-

ond invention and most successful to date is the Ezee Opener. Small enough to fit on a key chain, this versatile tool easily opens bottle twist-tops, cans with tabs and nontwist bottle caps. Sahli invented it for his wife who struggled to open twist-top bottles. It's particularly popular at Unclaimed Freight in Milaca where it's said to be the hottest item in the store. Locally, the Ezee Opener can be purchased at Klatt Electric in Buffalo and online at ezeeopener.com.

Recently Sahli had a bout with lung cancer, but it hasn't gotten him down. He predicts more useful inventions are soon to come.

After months of development, CBD of Maple Lake has released a revolutionary new marijuana infused bait just in time for the ice fishing season owner Mary Jane announced at 4:20 this afternoon.

Concocted in the local store's own basement laboratory, the bait combines the smells fish love with a tincture of THC that will be as addicting to fish as the store's fudge brownies are to humans.

The key to the bait's success is in the two-step process, Jane explained. First a THC oil laced with fragrance is used as a liquid attractant.

"Two or three drops in the water is all it takes," she said. "The fish will home in on the vapor trail and ingest the oil as they swim. Once ingested, they will start to experience a false sense of well-being, then the munchies will hit, that's when you drop the

Something shiny is really all it takes to impress the fish's heightened sensory perception at this point, but to make it irresistible, Jane has created her Funny Fish Lure (sold separately)

that plays to the fish's sudden craving for bizarre snack foods. Jane's vast expertise being high as a kite has helped her to come up with four irresistible flavors: potato chip, ice cream, pepperoni, and French fries.

"My Reefer Oil combined with the

Funny Fish Lure is foolproof. Any creature swimming within 50 yards is going to go bananas for it," she said. "If there are fish in the area, you will catch them."

Local bait store owners predict Jane's Reefer Oil and Funny Fish Lures will sell like space cakes and they are eager to get in on the action.

"In theory, anglers won't have to worry about water temperature, or the phases of the moon affecting how fish bite anymore. As every stoner knows, there is no resisting the munchies when they set in," said Rip Bong owner of Kiss my Bass Sports Shop.



Jane's invention is already putting Maple Lake on the map. Prior to its public release the bait was given a trial run on the state's largest bass fishing tour, The Bad Bass Open. "My friend who fishes professionally said he'd give it a go and they all loved it,"

It's already been nominated for best new product of the year and even attracted national attention when a

post went viral of the President himself swaying on his yacht to Black Sabbath's "Sweet Leaf" with a lunker on his line.

"This hooch is downright addicting, man," commented 2023 US Bassin Champion Holden Dink, "not to say I've indulged in Reefer Oil myself, although I may have taken a rip from my own stash before this interview, what I mean to say is those fish won't stand a chance once they puff the dragon."

Despite local bait shop's eagerness to carry the product in their stores, Jane says she plans to sell it exclusively at Maple Lake CBD at least until all the kinks are worked out. One of the hiccups she's had to deal with, she said, is finding a way to make the bait less attractive to people. She's put labels on the product stating it's not for human consumption, but some anglers have taken to ingesting the oil themselves.

"The oil itself won't hurt them, but when the munchies set in and they start eating the potato chip flavored lures then they have a problem," Jane said. "A half a dozen of those 'professionals' on the bass tour last summer had to have hooks surgically removed from their lips."

"My lawyer Sue Yoo says I'm not liable because I have that indemnity clause on every Reefer Oil and Funny Fish Lure label, so I'm not worried about that, I just don't want anyone to get hurt," she said. "My products are meant to make you feel groovy, not the opposite of groovy."

As an incentive to use her product only as directed, she is offering a free package of THC Gummies with every Reefer Oil and Funny Fish Lure combo bought at her store now through the start of the big Ice Fishing Derby. The hope is that anglers will munch on the gummies, mellow out and leave the bait to the fishes.

## Minnesota DNR releases updated 10-year Invasive Carp management action plan

The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) has released the updated Invasive Carp Action Plan for the next 10 years of prevention and management efforts in Min-

The plan includes a prioritized set of recommended actions that build upon the DNR's current intensive invasive carp efforts, including additional actions in the categories of:

- · Monitoring invasive carp populations to support response actions
- · Prevention and deterrence to limit migration in the state
- Response preparation to ensure swift actions if invasive carp are found in new locations
- · Management and control strategies to remove fish and minimize populations

· Outreach, communication and coordination to work with key partners and the public to minimize risk and impacts to the state

"Minnesota is a leader in the use of cutting-edge invasive carp management strategies to protect our waters as well as a leader in collaborative planning," DNR Commissioner Sarah Strommen said. "I want to thank the partners who engaged in the process to inform this plan. Today's updated action plan is a road map that will guide the DNR's work with our partners and all Minnesotans to minimize the impact of silver, grass, bighead and black carp on our state."

The DNR's update of the plan was informed by engagement with more than a dozen agencies and organizations involved in preventing the spread of invasive carp in the Mississippi River.

"As we have said before, invasive carp prevention and management is a team effort, and the DNR is fortunate to be part of a big team," DNR Invasive Carp Coordinator Grace Loppnow said. "The updated action plan prioritizes a range of prevention and management techniques - because we want to use the methods that are proving most effective. There is no single solution to this complex challenge."

#### Invasive carp management efforts

The DNR and partners are already using a wide range of efforts to manage invasive carp, including tagging and tracking invasive carp to better understand and exploit their movements, contracting with commercial fishing operations to target invasive carp, and developing and testing new methods to capture invasive carp. In addition to continuing and expanding these existing efforts, the updated Action Plan also includes steps to further evaluate potential invasive carp barriers and other deterrents to protect Minnesota. To date, no evidence of invasive carp reproduction has been observed in Minnesota waters.

#### Additional information about invasive carp in Minnesota

Invasive carp have been moving upstream since escaping into the Mississippi River from commercial fish farms in Arkansas in the 1970s. These fish compete with native species, and silver carp are known to jump out of the water in a way that can pose a risk to boaters.

Individual invasive carp have been caught as far upstream as Pool 2 of the Mississippi River in the Twin Cities metro area (bighead, grass and silver), the King Power Plant on the St. Croix River by Oak Park Heights (bighead and silver), and just downstream of Granite Falls in the Minnesota River (bighead).

State and federal funding sources, including the Environmental and Natural Resources Trust Fund and Outdoor Heritage Fund, have provided key funding for the DNR's invasive carp detection and response program.

Invasive carp captures in Minnesota must be reported to the DNR immediately by calling 651-587-2781 or emailing invasivecarp.dnr@ state.mn.us. People are asked to take a photo and transport the carp to the nearest DNR fisheries office or make arrangements for it to be picked up by a DNR official. A permit can be requested to keep captured invasive carp for consumption or disposal.


